**I. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m.

**II. Roll Call:**

Members Present: Commissioners Kena Abdissa, Kevin Dostal Dauer, Tom Harkins (arrived at 6:46 p.m.), Duncan Potter, and Adam Stout.

Members Absent: Chair Mark Jansen, Commissioner Liza Allen and Roberto Valdizan.

Also Present: Director Tony Paetznick, Assistant Director of Community Assets and Development Ben Gozola, Councilmember Jeanne Frischman, and Dave Matteson (Allina Health).

**III. Approval of Agenda**

Motion by Stout, seconded by Potter to approve the July 14, 2025 agenda as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

**IV. Approval of Minutes**

Motion by Abdissa, seconded by Stout to approve the June 9, 2025 minutes as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

**V. Presentations and Business Items**

**A. New Brighton Cannabis Regulations Overview**

Director Paetznick stated Ben Gozola, Assistant Director of Community Assets and Development, will lead the Public Safety Commission through the City's adopted regulations on Cannabis, and will be ready to answer your questions about this new industry soon to begin throughout the state.

Assistant Director of Community Assets and Development Ben Gozola provided the Commission with information on the City's cannabis regulations. He explained Ordinance 911 was drafted six months ago after reviewing the Office of Cannabis Management's ordinance template. He reported a draft ordinance was reviewed by the Planning Commission, EDC and the City Council before being approved in November of 2024. He

commented further on the 400 foot buffer map noting where retail establishments could be located in the community and described the different types of cannabis business licenses that could be issued by the City. He commented further on the City's cannabis ordinance and asked for comments or questions.

Discussion included:

- Staff commented on the cannabis license that had been requested by Lucky Strains.
- Buffer requirements surrounding schools were discussed.
- Staff provided further information regarding temporary cannabis permits.
- The Commission recommended private schools and after school programs be included in the buffer zone.
- The Commission discussed how low potency THC products were now being sold at Cub Foods and other local convenience stores.
- The Commission thanked Assistant Director Gozola for his detailed information and presentation.

## **VI. Reports and Updates**

Dave Matteson provided the Commission with an update from Allina Health. He reviewed response times from June along with the number of calls for service. He commented on the calls for service year to date, noting there was a 3.6% increase in medical calls from 2024. He noted he has used mutual aid 33 times this year, with Hennepin County providing mutual aid 21 times. He discussed the upcoming education and training his EMT's would be receiving. He explained how he was bound by law to respond to 911 calls and indicated there was growing abuse of this EMT services.

Councilmember Frischman reported the ALPR cameras request was reviewed and approved by the City Council.

Director Paetznick explained potential locations for the cameras was discussed with Flock and County permits have been requested. He indicated the City was still waiting for grant funding to be awarded before moving forward with the camera purchase and installation. He was pleased to report the County Road D apartment private cameras were already installed.

Councilmember Frischman explained the City Council reviewed the parking regulations after receiving feedback from this Commission. She commented on the fire department family annual picnic and suggested a fire and police family picnic be held in 2026. She suggested the Public Safety Commission be invited to this event.

Director Paetznick provided the Commission with an update on staffing. He explained a new officer began with the department today and stated Investigator Joe Pyka would be moving to the State.

Director Paetznick reported a Splash Bash and mobile City Hall event would be held on Tuesday, July 29 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Lions Park.

Director Paetznick stated National Night Out would be held on Tuesday, August 5 and Stockyard Days would be held August 8 through August 10.

Director Paetznick commented on the story time at the fire station event that was held on Thursday, July 10.

Director Paetznick explained the third body worn camera audit was recently completed on the New Brighton Public Safety Department and noted this information would be presented to the Commission in September.

Director Paetznick discussed the changes that were coming for the Suburban Ramsey County Water Rescue Task Force and commented on the training this group was receiving for water rescues.

Director Paetznick indicated a staff budget retreat would be held on Tuesday, July 15.

**VII. Adjournment**

Motion by Potter, seconded by Harkins to adjourn the meeting at 8:03 p.m. Motion carried 5-0.

# INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Dear Public Safety Director Paetznick:

An independent audit of the New Brighton Police Department's Portable Recording System (body-worn cameras (BWCs)) was conducted on July 8, 2025. The objective of the audit was to verify New Brighton Police Department's compliance with Minnesota Statutes §§13.825 and 626.8473.

Data elements the audit includes:

#### Minnesota Statute §13.825

- Data Classification
- Retention of Data
- Access by Data Subjects
- Inventory of Portable Recording System Technology
- Use of Agency-Issued Portable Recording Systems
- Authorization to Access Data
- Sharing Among Agencies

#### Minnesota Statute §626.8473

- Public Comment
- Portable Recording System Policy

The New Brighton Police Department is located in Ramsey County, Minnesota and is authorized for thirty-two (32) peace officers. The New Brighton Police Department utilizes Panasonic Arbitrator body-worn cameras and Genetec Clearance cloud-based evidence management storage. The audit covers the time period May 16, 2023, through June 30, 2025.

### **Audit Requirement: Data Classification**

*Determine if the data collected by BWCs are appropriately classified.*

The New Brighton Police Department BWC data is presumptively private. All BWC data collected during the audit period is classified as private or nonpublic data. The New Brighton Police Department had no instances of the discharge of a firearm by a peace officer, use of force that resulted in substantial bodily harm, requests from data subjects for the data to be made

accessible to the public, or court orders directing the agency to release the BWC data to the public.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Retention of Data**

*Determine if the data collected by BWC's are appropriately retained and destroyed in accordance with statutes.*

The New Brighton Police Department utilizes the General Records Retention Schedule for Minnesota Cities and agency specified retention periods in Genetec. At the conclusion of a BWC recording, officers assign a category to the recording. Each category has an associated retention period. Upon reaching the retention date, data is systematically deleted.

Genetec queries and a Genetec log report of active body camera data collected during the audit period were reviewed and confirmed that BWC data is being retained in accordance with the record retention schedule. All records were maintained for at least the minimum 90 days required by statute.

BWC video, meta data, and audit trails are purged from Genetec upon reaching the specified retention period. The New Brighton Police Department received no requests from data subjects to retain BWC data beyond the applicable retention period.

BWC data is monitored for proper categorization to ensure data are appropriately retained and destroyed.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Access by Data Subjects**

*Determine if individuals who are the subject of collected data have access to the data, and if the data subject requests a copy of the data, other individuals who do not consent to its release must be redacted.*

BWC data is available to data subjects and access may be requested by submission of a New Brighton Data Request Form. During the audit period, the New Brighton Police Department received both requests to view and requests for copies of BWC data from data subjects. Data subjects who had not consented to release of the data were redacted. Access by data subjects is documented in the Genetec audit log.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Inventory of Portable Recording System Technology**

*Determine the total number of recording devices owned and maintained by the agency; a daily record of the total number of recording devices actually deployed and used by officers, the policies and procedures for use of portable recording systems by required by section 626.8473; and the total amount of recorded audio and video collected by the portable recording system and maintained by the agency, the agency's retention schedule for the data, the agency's procedures for destruction of the data, and that the data are available to the public.*

The New Brighton Police Department's BWC inventory consists of thirty-two (32) devices. BWC devices are assigned to individual officers. An inventory of the total number of devices owned by the agency is maintained in Genetec. The inventory includes the name of the officer assigned to the device, the serial number, and the BWC model.

The New Brighton Police Department's BWC policy that governs the use of portable recording systems by peace officers while in the performance of their duties. The policy requires officers to conduct a function test of their BWC at the beginning of each shift to make sure the device is operating properly. Officers noting a malfunction during testing or at any other time are required to promptly report the malfunction to their supervisor.

Peace officers were trained on the use of BWC's during in-service training at the time of implementation. Newly hired officers are trained as part of their field training program.

Officers working on randomly selected dates, and randomly selected calls for service, were verified against Genetec and the Genetec report log and confirmed that BWCs are being deployed and officers are wearing and activating their BWCs. A comparison between the total number of BWC videos created per quarter and calls for service shows a consistent collection of BWC data.

The Genetec dashboard and the Genetec log report detail the total amount of BWC data created and stored/maintained. The New Brighton Police Department utilizes the General Records Retention Schedule for Minnesota cities and agency-specified retention in Genetec.

BWC video is fully deleted from Genetec upon reaching its scheduled deletion date. BWC data is available upon request, and access may be requested by submission of New Brighton Data Request Form.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Use of Agency-Issued Portable Recording Systems**

*Determine if peace officers are only allowed to use portable recording systems issued and*

*maintained by the officer's agency.*

The New Brighton Police Department's BWC policy states that Officers may use only department-issued BWCs in the performance of official duties for the agency or when otherwise performing authorized law enforcement services as an employee of the department.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Authorization to Access Data**

*Determine if the agency complies with sections 13.05, Subd. 5, and 13.055 in the operation of portable recording systems and in maintaining portable recording system data.*

Supervisors conduct reviews of BWC data to ensure data is properly labeled and that BWCs are being utilized in compliance with policy.

Nonpublic BWC data is only available to persons whose work assignment reasonably requires access to the data. User access to BWC data is managed by the assignment of roles and permissions in Genetec. Permissions are based on staff work assignments. User roles and permissions are administered by the Deputy Director. Access to Genetec is password protected and requires dual authentication.

The agency's BWC Policy governs access to BWC data. Agency personnel are authorized to access BWC data for legitimate law enforcement or data administration purposes and only when there is a business need for doing so. User access to BWC data is captured in the audit trail. The BWC policy states that the unauthorized access to or disclosure of BWC data may constitute misconduct and subject individuals to disciplinary action and criminal penalties pursuant to Minn. Statute § 13.09.

When BWC data is deleted from Genetec, its contents cannot be determined. The New Brighton Police Department has had no security breaches. A BCA CJIS security audit was conducted in 2023.

*No discrepancies noted.*

### **Audit Requirement: Sharing Among Agencies**

*Determine if nonpublic BWC data shared with other law enforcement agencies, government entities, or federal agencies is in accordance with statute.*

The New Brighton Police Department's BWC and Records Maintenance and Release policies govern the sharing of BWC data. BWC data may be shared with other law enforcement agencies, prosecutors, courts, and other criminal justice entities as provided by law. Agencies seeking

access to BWC data are required to submit a written request. Sharing of data is documented in the Genetec audit log.

*No discrepancies noted.*

#### **Audit Requirement: Biennial Audit**

*Determine if the agency maintains records showing the date and time the portable recording system data were collected, the applicable classification of the data, how the data are used, and whether data are destroyed as required.*

Genetec logs document the date and time portable recording system data was collected. All BWC data collected during the audit period is classified as private or nonpublic data. Audit trails document how the data are used and shared.

*No discrepancies noted.*

#### **Audit Requirement: Portable Recording System Vendor**

*Determine if portable recording system data stored in the cloud, is stored in accordance with security requirements of the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation Criminal Justice Information Services Division Security Policy 5.4 or its successor version.*

The New Brighton Police Department BWC data is stored in the Genetec Clearance digital evidence management system. Genetec utilizes Microsoft Azure for Government cloud storage. Genetec and Microsoft Azure appear on the BCA list of screened vendors.

*No discrepancies noted.*

#### **Audit Requirement: Public Comment**

*Determine if the law enforcement agency provided an opportunity for public comment before it purchased or implemented a portable recording system and if the governing body with jurisdiction over the budget of the law enforcement agency provided an opportunity for public comment at a regularly scheduled meeting.*

The New Brighton Police Department solicited public comment prior to the purchase and implementation of the body worn camera program. Public comment was solicited on social media, Survey Monkey, newspapers, and the City website. The New Brighton City Council held a public hearing at their January 8, 2019 meeting.

*No discrepancies noted.*

**Audit Requirement: Body-worn Camera Policy**

*Determine if a written policy governing the use of portable recording systems has been established and is enforced.*


The New Brighton Police Department has established and enforces a BWC policy. The policy was compared to the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 626.8473, Subd. 3(b). The policy includes all minimum requirements of Minn. Stat. § 626.8473, Subd. 3(b). The BWC policy is posted on the agency's website.
